After working with various bands including Killiecrankie, Cambridge, Ontario musician Allison Lupton began releasing music under her own name in 2001 with her debut album “My True Love”. The album launched her solo career, performing across Canada, the United States, and the UK. Allison has since recorded 4 solo CDs and in 2015 was awarded Folk Music Ontario’s *Songs From The Heart Grand Prize* for her song "One More Day". Allison has been honoured with nominations by the **Canadian Folk Music Awards** including most recently (2020) “Traditional Singer of the Year”.
